Cloud Computing Offered Spring 2020

Beginning Spring 2020, Delgado will offer a Cloud Computing Associates of Applied Science (A.A.S.) and a Career and Technical Certificate (C.T.C.) in Cloud Computing Foundations. Credits earned in the C.T.C. can be applied to the A.A.S.

The curriculum will prepare students for entry-level positions in cloud computing and provide a foundation for further studies in cloud computing. Students will receive instruction on the overall computer information technology environment, local and virtual computer networks, networked data security, management of IT projects, and IT support for cloud systems.

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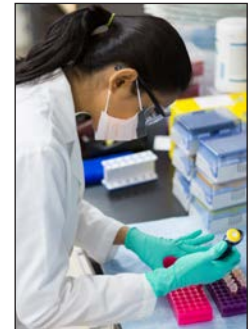

Science Lab Tech Program Leads to Careers

Delgado's associate degree program in Science Laboratory Technology (SLT) trains students for positions in laboratory science. Students can choose from two concentrations within the program—biotechnology and chemical technology—and can enter into a variety of career paths like pharmaceuticals, in vitro fertilization, organ / tissue culturing, ecology, farming, green energy, food processing / manufacturing, oil / gas, and more.

Many students have secured positions in New Orleans or have chosen to pursue further educational goals. Research-based fields are booming in the New Orleans area and students who have successfully completed the SLT program are getting jobs with annual starting salaries between \$35,000 - \$50,000.

Delgado's Motor Vehicle Technology program is ideal for students who enjoy studying how things work, working with their hands, and solving problems. We offer associate degree and certificate programs in Motor Vehicle Technology with concentrations in collision repair and general automotive, and a C.T.C. in Motor Vehicle Maintenance and Light Repair.

Delgado also offers the following manufacturer training programs: GM ASEP, Ford ASSET, MOPAR CAP Local, and Audi Academy.

Auto technicians must have the skills and knowledge of the latest technology and equipment to repair complex engines, transmissions, and other computerized systems—and Delgado can train students in these Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) areas: Engine Repair ASE A1, Automatic Transmissions/Transaxles ASE A2, Manual Drive Trains and Axles ASE A3, Suspensions and Steering ASE A4, Brakes ASE A5, Electrical/Electronic Systems ASE A6, Heating and Air Conditioning ASE A7, Engine Performance ASE A8.



Delgado's instruction, facilities, and equipment have been evaluated and certified by the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) and meet the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence standards for the training of automotive technicians.
