Program begins in August and continues for 12 months through July

Application Components

- Electronic Nuclear Medicine Technology program application
- Technical Performance Standards review and any required acknowledgment
- Documentation of at least 30 hours of nuclear medicine observation, volunteer, or work experience in at least two facilities
- Unofficial and official transcripts from all colleges attended, as applicable
- Letters of recommendation required by the current online application

Eligibility Requirements

1. Be a graduate of an accredited associate-degree allied health occupation program, or have completed at least 60 credit hours of previous college coursework.
2. Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 across all colleges attended.
3. Complete at least 30 hours of observation, volunteer, or work experience in at least two nuclear medicine technology facilities.
4. Complete all required prerequisite courses listed below.
5. Be able to meet the Nuclear Medicine Technology Program Technical Performance Standards.

Application Instructions

College Application

Apply for admission to Delgado Community College before completing the NUMT program application. [Open the Delgado College Application](#)

Transcripts

- Upload unofficial transcripts from each college or university attended other than Delgado, as directed in the online application.
- Send official transcripts from every college or university attended other than Delgado directly to the Delgado Registrar's Office. Transcripts submitted to the Nuclear Medicine Technology Program by the applicant are not considered official.
- If you apply while enrolled in college, submit an updated transcript after the semester ends.
- Electronic official transcripts may be sent to healthsciencetrans@dcc.edu through Parchment or the National Student Clearinghouse.

Documentation of Nuclear Medicine Experience

A minimum of 30 total hours is required in at least two nuclear medicine technology facilities. Observation, volunteer service, and paid work experience may be used. Complete the documentation section in the online application and submit any required verification forms by May 15.

Letters of Recommendation

Request recommendations early enough for all required letters to arrive by May 15. Follow the current online application for the number, format, and submission method.

Technical Performance Standards

Review the current NUMT Technical Performance Standards before applying and complete any acknowledgment required by the application. [View Nuclear Medicine Technology Admissions and Technical Standards](#)

After Submission

The Allied Health Admissions Office will use the email address on your application for receipt acknowledgments and notices about missing credentials. Check your email regularly, including spam or junk folders. A complete application does not guarantee admission; applications are reviewed by the Nuclear Medicine Faculty Admissions Committee.
