Accreditations

- Police officers are required to participate in firearms re-certification annually.
- All officers are First Responder & CPR Certified.
- Police officers are required to have Louisiana Board of Ethics Certification yearly.

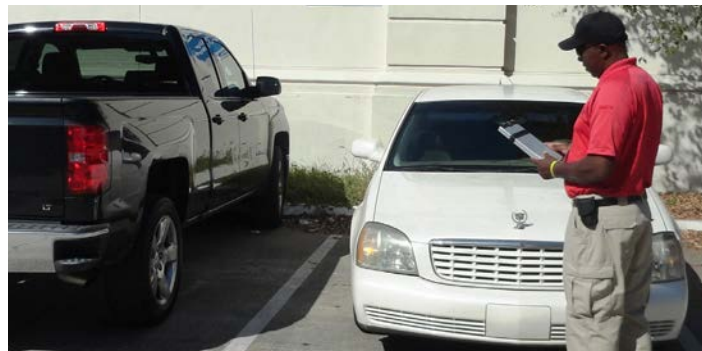
- NEVER resist an armed robber. Make mental note of suspect and circumstances and immediately report the crime to Delgado Campus Police office or dial 911.
- If you are being victimized by a person attempting sexual assault, stall for time to figure out your options. Each situation is different. If you decide to fight, hit hard and fast, targeting the eyes and groin. Attempt to dissuade attack by vomiting, urinating, or feigning illness.

Services Provided

- Patrol of six Delgado campus properties and vicinity via marked police vehicles, motorized carts, bicycle, and foot patrol
- Enforcement of state and municipal laws and ordinances, Delgado rules and regulations
- Investigation of criminal complaints and auto accidents

occurring on property

- Opening and securing buildings and doors
- Promotion of crime prevention and safety measures
- Emergency and personal escort services.
- Traffic monitoring and mediation
- Enforcement of parking rules and regulations
- Issuance of Delgado ID and proxy card clearances
- Issuance of door keys
- Event security
- Assistance in the judicial hearing process



Campus Safety Tips

- When working late or taking a late class, avoid using stairs in remote areas of the building.
- Do not be distracted when walking. Be aware of your surroundings. Travel in groups when possible and in well lighted areas.
- Call for police escort to your vehicle if you feel uncomfortable alone.
- Report suspicious persons or circumstances to police immediately.
- Check back seats/floor before entering your vehicle. Lock doors immediately.
